
 Independent non-profit lobby organisation

Relationship with State






State - Executive

 Numerous studies and recommendations support long term development






State - Parliament


 Low political will to regulate/restrict it-self

Relationship with Municipalities




 Small community increase the risks of conflict of interest

Relationship with Private sector




Low maturity on corruption risk identification

Relationship with Media


