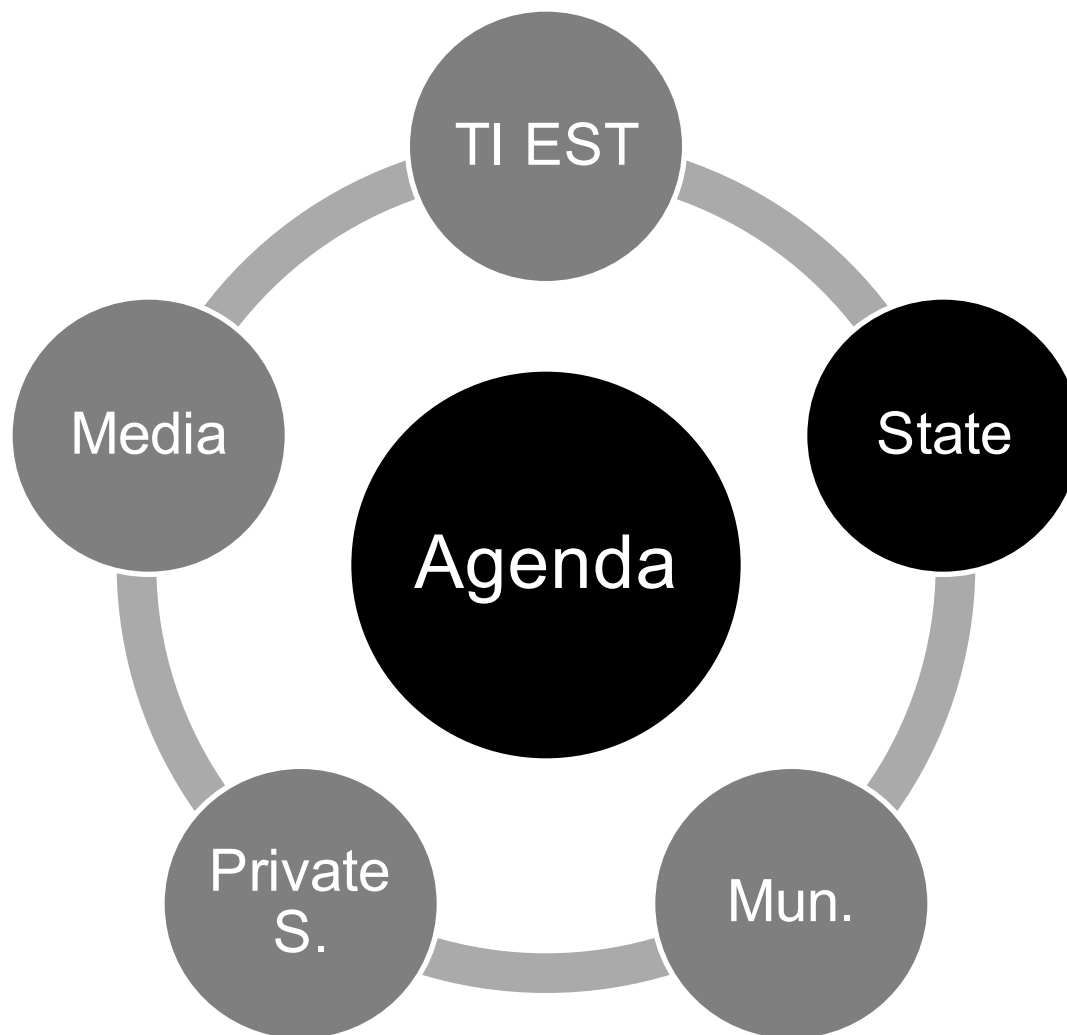


# Transparency International Estonia

- Objective to study, make aware and lobby for change

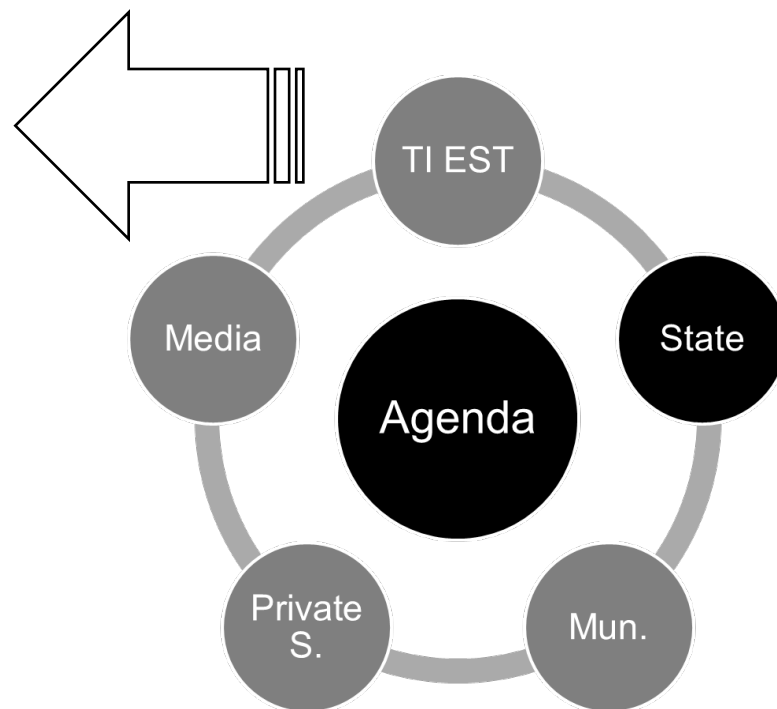


# Relationship with State



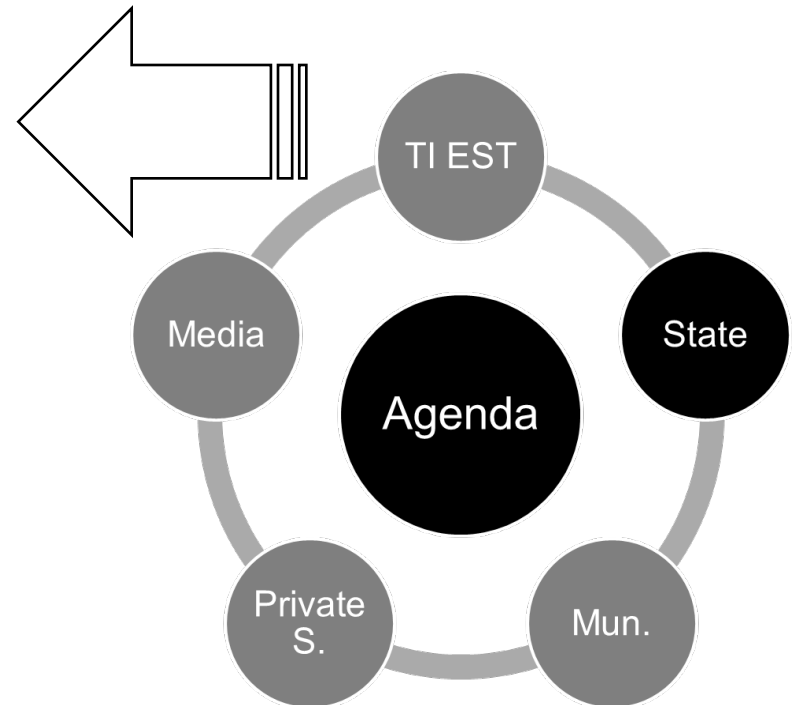
# State – Executive

- Numerous studies and recommendations support long term development

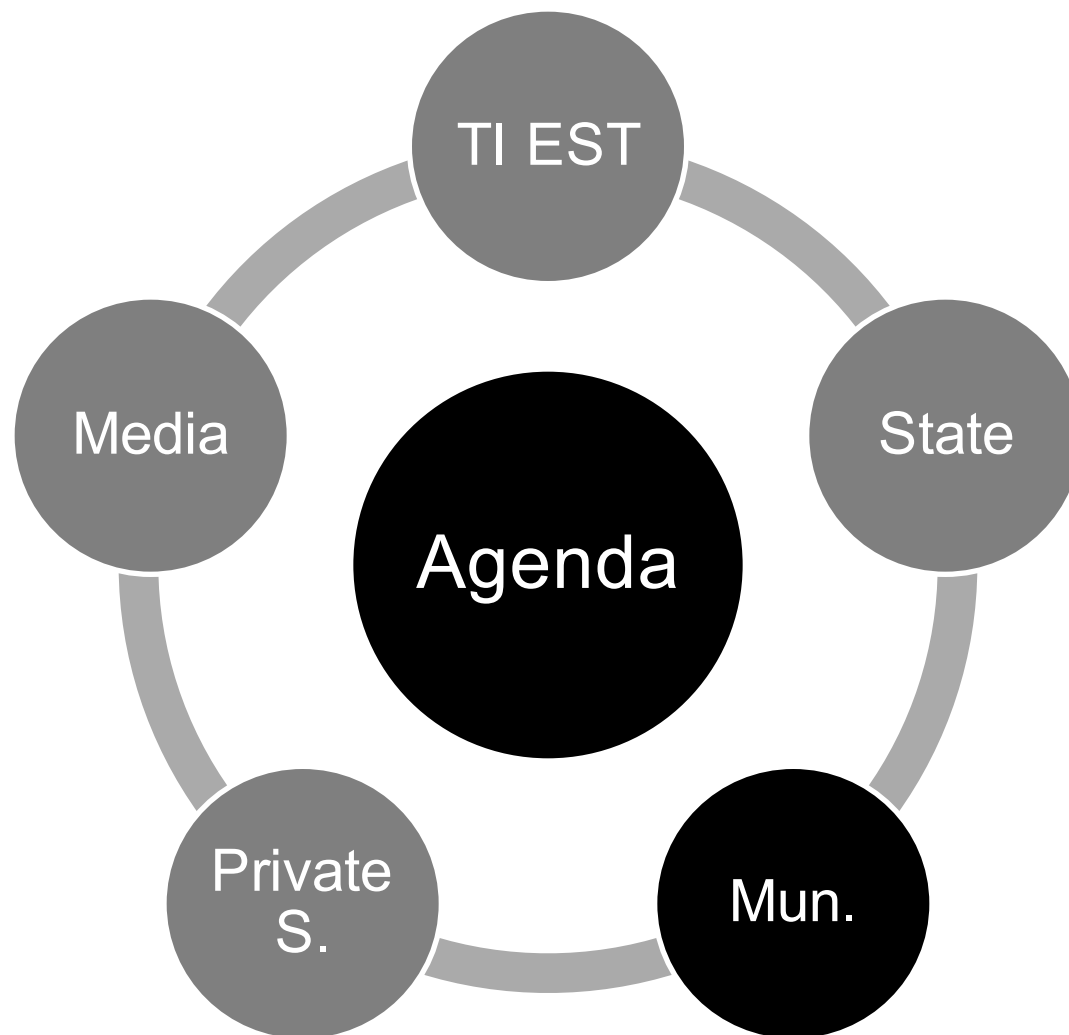


# State - Parliament

- Quickly changing priorities



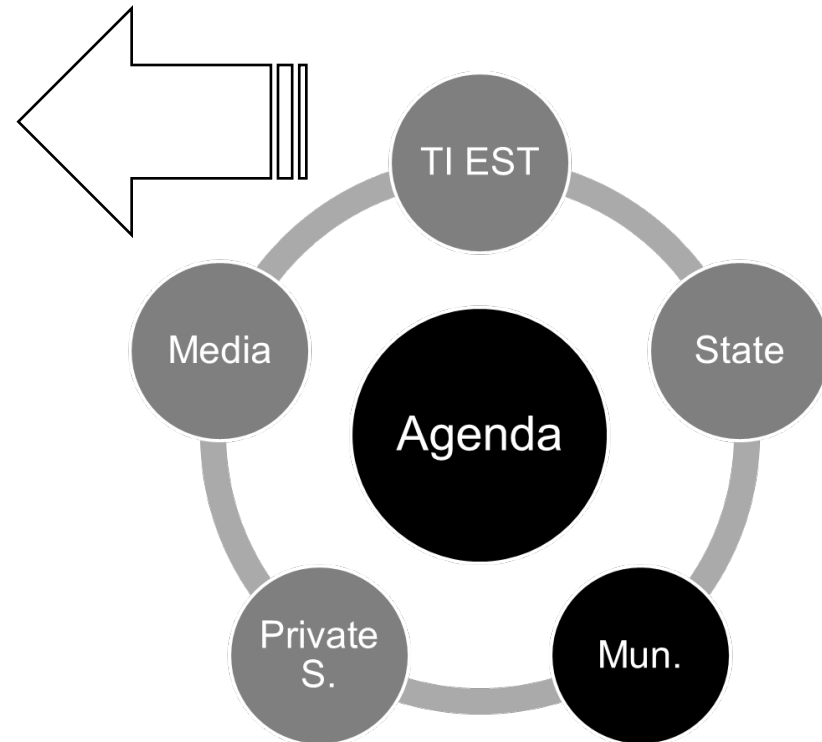
# Relationship with Municipalities



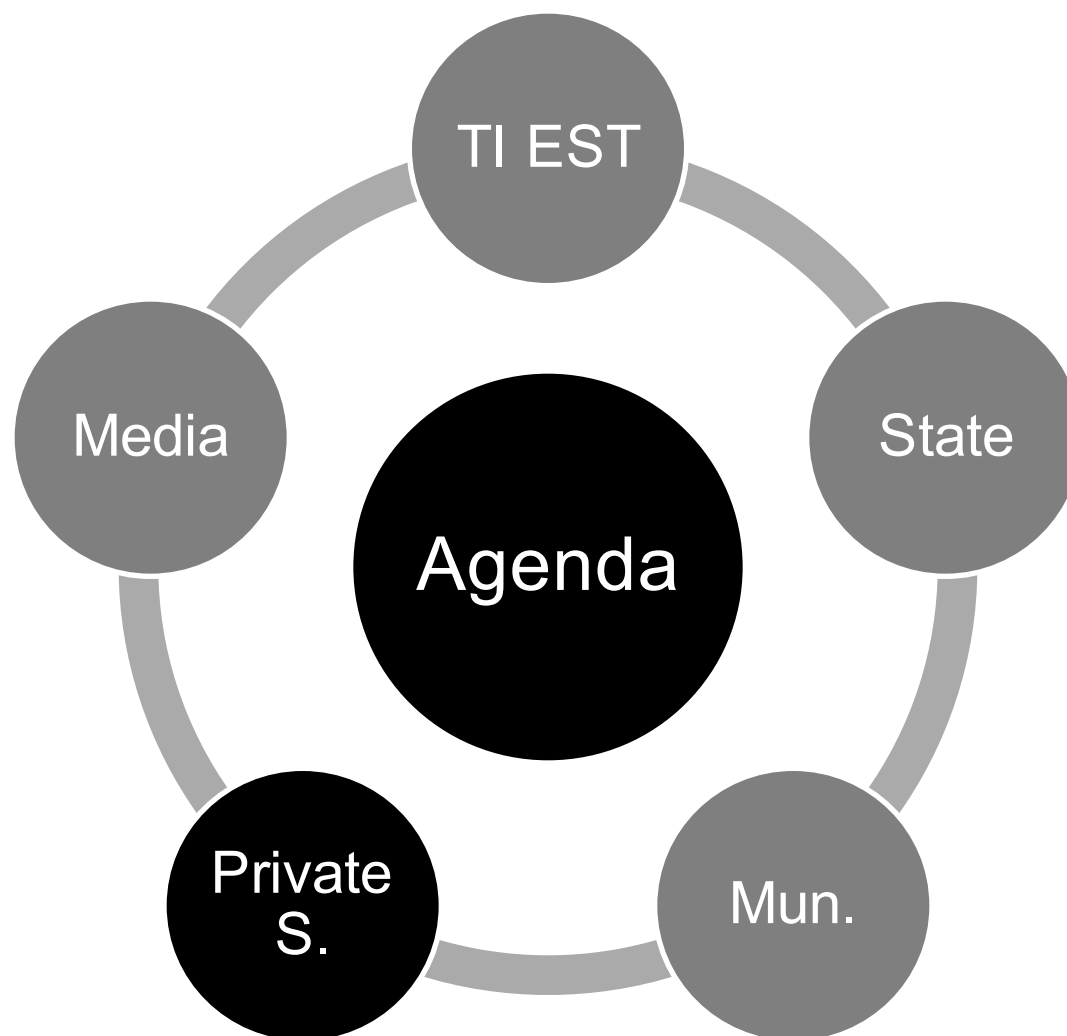


# Municipalities

- Low knowledge level → low commitment

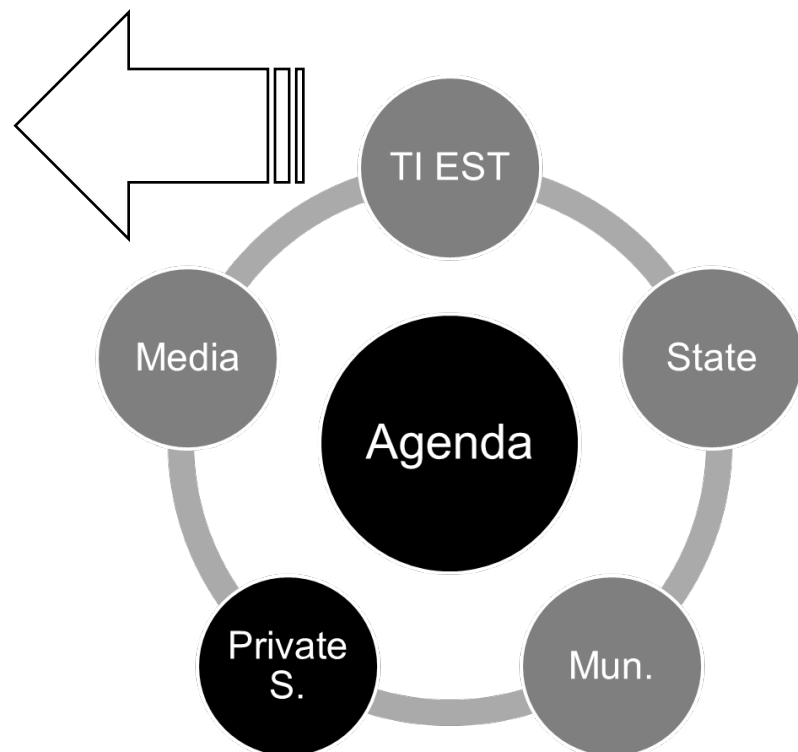


# Relationship with Private sector

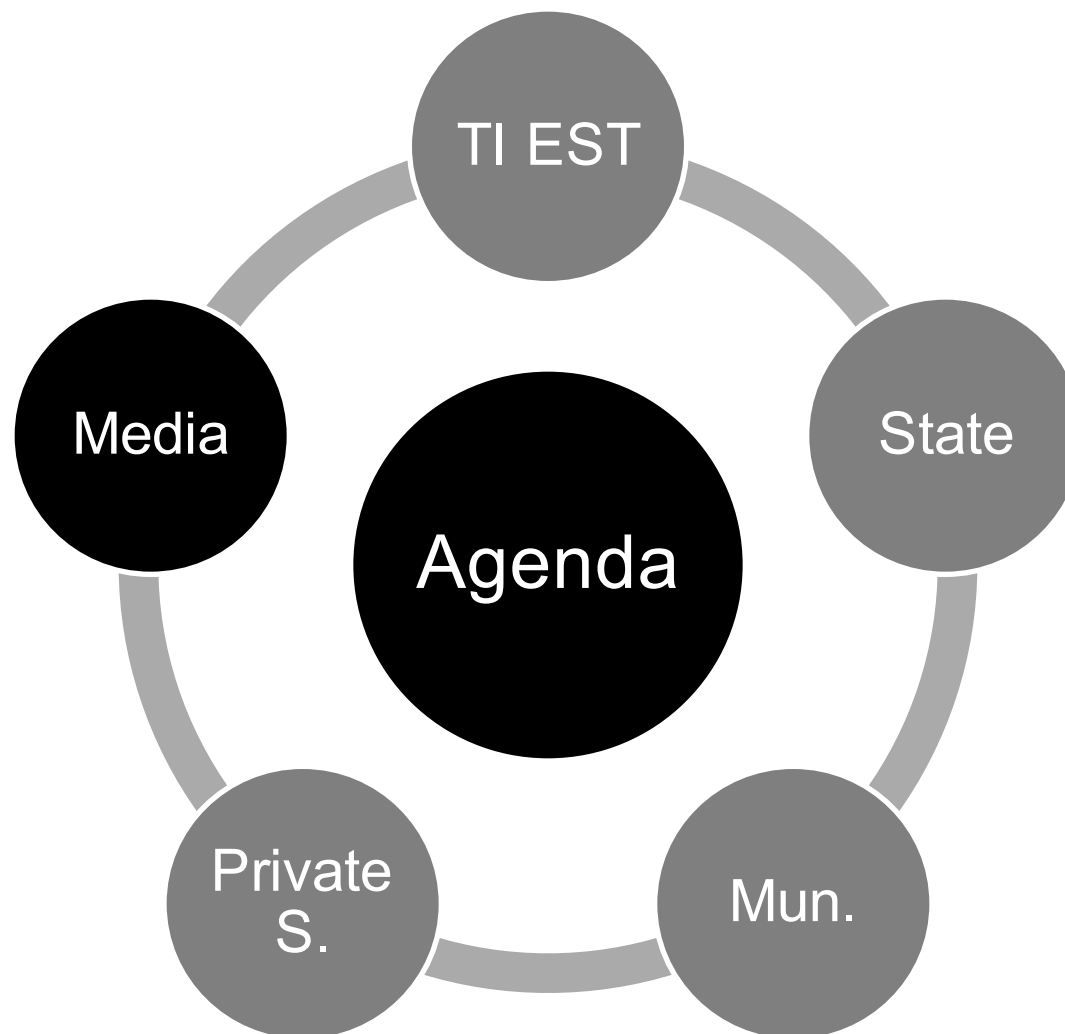


# Private sector

- “I can not change alone”

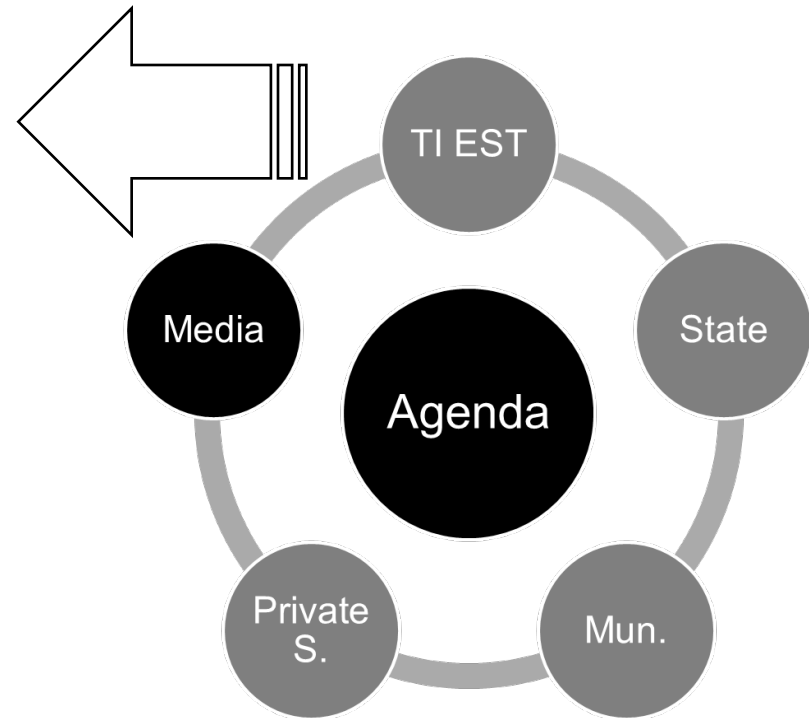


# Relationship with Media
